If This Is Your First Mass

If this is your first Mass since the return of public celebration of Masses, please review the following information to know what to expect.

- **Please stay home if you are feeling ill and/or are more vulnerable to the virus. The dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will continue for the foreseeable future. Cardinal Seán strongly encourages people in vulnerable populations, especially the elderly and those with complicating physical conditions, to continue to watch Mass from their homes, on their parish's social media or on CatholicTV. We will continue to use Facebook Live, with an exciting announcement coming regarding the future of the parish's use of livestreaming.**
- Please use the bathroom before coming to church.
- You need to bring and wear a mask. (not for children under the age of two or those with health conditions that make it not possible, optional for children ages 2-5)
- Bring your own bottle of hand sanitizer if you can.
- In ordinary circumstances, please use only the handicap door entrance to enter the church. This allows us to monitor the number of people in the church and minimizes the number of entrances and exits that need to be sanitized after Mass. Once inside, if an emergency exists that requires leaving the church, please use all available exits.
- Follow the one-way traffic patterns and other instructions in church.

What Will Look Different

What will look different to you as the celebration of public Masses resume?

- There will be no processions at the Masses, including no offertory processions.
- There will be no altar servers unless a seminarian with whom I live is serving.
- There will be no choirs.
- There will be no congregational singing.
- Those serving in the sanctuary will be respecting social distancing, though not wearing masks except during the distribution of Holy Communion.

- There must be no passing of the basket for the offertory. Please register for electronic giving [here](#), mail in your offertory, or place your contribution in the basket as you exit.
- During the consecration, hosts to be distributed will be placed on a second corporal to the side, so that they are not directly in front of the priest.
- There should be no holding of hands during the Our Father.
- There will be no invitation to participate in a sign of peace.
- For the distribution of Holy Communion:
 - There will be one communion station.
 - There will be no distribution of the Precious Blood.
 - The communicants and the priest will wear masks.
 - Neither the priest nor the communicants should wear gloves during the distribution of Holy Communion.
 - Congregants who are not coming forward to receive Holy Communion or a blessing should still get out of their pews at the beginning, so that no one will have to climb over anyone else.
 - The priest will have a table next to him with hand sanitizer.
 - The priest will hold the consecrated host over the communicants' outstretched hands and place the host into their hands without touching their hands.
 - Communicants will receive the consecrated host in their hands, step to the side, lower their mask, consume the host, replace their mask, and return to their pew.
 - In the case of unintentional contact, the priest will sanitize his own hands immediately.
 - If the priest himself is a member of a vulnerable population, a deacon or a trained lay minister should distribute communion.
 - The people should return to their pews by a different route, to avoid contact with approaching people. Please follow the arrows showing how to return to the pews.
- You will be encouraged to leave the church within a couple of minutes of the end of the Mass. The priest or trained volunteers will direct row by row exiting.

I encourage you to be patient and cooperative as we gradually, incrementally, and safely resume the public celebration of Masses.

Current Weekday Mass Schedule and Open Hours for Our Churches:

- Monday, Wednesday, Friday
St. Anthony: Mass at 7:00 a.m. with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament each Friday after Mass from 7:30 to 8:30 a.m.
- Tuesday and Thursday
St. Mary: Masses at 9:00 with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament each Thursday after Mass from 9:30 to 10:30 a.m.

Please use the following doors when accessing the churches when they are open:

- **St. Anthony:** The only door open will be the side door closest to the parish center.

- **St. Mary:** The only door open will be the right side door on the Samoset Avenue side of the church. Handicap door accessibility can be arranged by contacting the parish office.

When visiting either church, please use these doors only, follow instructions for social distancing and sanitizing, and observe directions for confession. Please consider wearing a mask and gloves when coming to church. Confessions will be in the "cry" room at Saint Anthony Parish and in the hall at Saint Mary Parish. The confession area will be set up to preserve the confidentiality of the sacrament, practice social distancing, and allow each person to choose to remain anonymous or not.
